minimal interruption to the restaurant's normal operations.

Chris Wissing, project manager for Lacy Construction, was pleased with the results. "By putting together a detailed schedule and working closely with our subs and suppliers, we were able to condense what would normally take seven to ten days down to three days for the kitchen renovation."

The exterior work entailed removing the mansard on three sides of the building and replacing it with an EIFS finished design that was provided by Arby's. Also, we removed the existing vestibule entry to make room for the new "Pinnacle," which is a welded steel structure three stories high that was manufactured off-site and placed fully assembled.

"What we accomplished in a time span of 72 hours was incredible," says Scott Zana, owner of Grand Island's Arby's restaurants. "Communication was critical for this project. Chris Wissing and Martin Evans (project superintendent) made sure that we were well informed and did a great job of coordinating all the work that needed to be accomplished in a short amount of time."
